# Q & A on the Election and Annual Meeting

In all the Townhalls and in emails and conversations with the Board or Communication Committee, a number of questions have been raised. We have developed this Q&A to provide answers to some of the most frequently asked questions. This is not a comprehensive list of all questions. Please remember that you can submit your specific questions through the link on the website, or directly to a Board member.

#### Q: Why the rush to vote on these documents now? How did we get here?

A: To recap the process - This was initiated by the previous Board in 2021 at the advice of our attorneys who stated that our documents were out of date and did not reflect current legislation. The previous Board budgeted for this in 2022 (\$15,000). A first draft was completed in August of 2023 and outgoing President George Wooten and incoming President Jeff Bregar reviewed them together. At this point the new Board was in place, feedback was provided to the lawyers, and the current draft was received in late 2023. The Board then posted and sent the documents to the owners for a vote.

#### Q: What if these new documents do not pass? What happens then?

A: If they don't pass, the new Board would need to start the process again using the updated documents as the starting point. At the recommendation of the lawyers, our documents must be updated to reflect new laws and regulations. Wiggins would still be governed under our existing documents.

#### Q: What if these new documents do pass?

A: Our community would be run under these new, legally current documents with an updated voting process.

#### Q: If these documents are passed, can they be changed in the future?

A: Yes. Amendments to the documents can be proposed by the Board or owners and the process for amending documents is then followed. Our documents have been amended many times over the years.

# Q: I've heard that the new documents impact the Lakes, that the Lakes would "cease to exist" ?

A: There is no merger language, financially or otherwise in these documents. The new documents maintain the existing practice of each association (Lakes, P1, P2) voting on issues that impact them. And there will still be 3 Board members from the Lakes and 3 from the Preserves. The change is that when amending documents, there are no more separate votes required; we vote as one community.

#### Q: What about the expiration date of the old documents?

A: Although these documents do not expire, the lawyers stated to the previous Board that they are outdated and not legally current, which is why the previous Board initiated the process to update these documents.

# Landscaping Update from Lynn Radicello and Don Rodner

While you may not be seeing new plantings lately, lots has been going on behind the scenes. Designs and bids have been submitted by Blue Landscaping Group for the first three priority areas:

- 1. Mechanicals including dumpster shed, back pool fencing, front of AC units for the Lakes (long buildings)
- 2. Privacy fencing along Gulf Harbor and Pan Am
- 3.Trees

Designs follow our criteria to be salt and drought tolerant, native as much as possible, lower maintenance, use of grasses, and complement existing plantings.

Additionally, you may have noticed the white flags throughout the community. These flags indicate where trees are planned to be planted!

It is anticipated that funding to implement all or some of the designs for the top priority areas will be covered by existing funds. Once the Board of Directors approves moving forward, planting will commence in these three priority areas. Please be patient as the small plants are planted (they will mature!) It is anticipated that the next round of planting will be in 4-6 weeks. Here are some sample designs shared by Blue:



2022 was the year of Hurricane Ian, but 2023 was the year our community began to bounce back. Our new Communication, Social, Welcoming and Holiday Decor committees began their work. # Activities and Events at Wiggins

We are posting this again so that everyone knows about all the activities scheduled during the season. If you are interested in participating in any of these activities, just go to the appropriate location at the time of the activity, meet the participants, and join in!



**Pickleball:** Scheduled daily from 9:00 - 10:30 a.m. Location: The tennis/pickleball courts. The courts are open on a first come first served basis at all other times of the day. The courts and our community pickleball are for Wiggins residents only.



**Book Club:** The third Thursday of every month from October to May. Time: 7 - 8:30 p.m. Location: Clubhouse. Books for discussion are selected by the members of the Club; discussions are always engaging. (The October and May meetings are held virtually; all other months meetings are in person.)

**Euchre:** Every Thursday at 7:30 p.m. (except for the third Thursday of the month when it shifts to Friday). Location: Clubhouse. Bring \$5.00 to play with a chance to win the pot at the end of the night.



**Poker:** Every Wednesday at 7:00 p.m. Location: Clubhouse.



**Bingo:** Second Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. Location: Clubhouse. \$5.00 per card, or 3 cards for \$10. Multiple games played per night; use the same cards all night.
