- Conducts yearly third-party audit of community financials for fiscal integrity



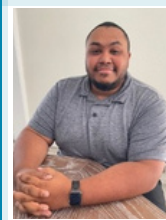

We have many new owners at Wiggins - WELCOME!!! Whether you are year-round or one of our many snowbirds, we are so glad you chose Wiggins as your home. We hope that you will enjoy our beautiful community, our many social activities, and most importantly, meet new friends.

Getting settled in a new community is always a challenge, so this is a brief **Frequently Asked Questions** sheet to help you get to know Wiggins.

Who do I call if I have any property issues?

For any property/outside issues, please contact our Property Manager, Derek Tatum. His office is in the Clubhouse, and his daily hours are 9-4. There is a link to contact him on our website homepage. Click on the link that says **Message to the Property Manager**. Fill in the contact form and Derek will get back to you within 24 hours. Derek's contact information: 239-484-5695 Email: dtatum@resortgroupinc.com. If you have a serious emergency after hours that cannot wait until the morning, call Resort Management at: 239-649-5526. This is for EMERGENCY use only.

How do I find out about all that is happening at Wiggins?

Contact Derek to make sure you are on our email blast list to receive all of our email communications. The Board publishes electronically a one page Weekly newsletter, **The Wiggins Weekly**, to keep everyone informed. Our Communications Committee publishes this newsletter, **What's Happening at Wiggins seasonally**. Both the Weekly and the Newsletter are also posted on the homepage of the website. We also use a texting program, Textedly, for emergency or essential information, so please provide Derek with your cellphone number so that he can add you to the Textedly list.

How do I access the Clubhouse?

Wiggins owners have access to our Clubhouse to gather, play board games, play ping pong, or just talk with each other whenever it is not scheduled for a community activity. Owners are able to reserve the Clubhouse to use for their own function, activity or meeting. There is a lock on the door with code access. Before you head over, just check the calendar on the website to make sure it is not booked. If it is available, you are welcome to come over! The door code for the clubhouse can be found in the Owners Section of the website. Once you put the code in, turn the deadbolt to the right. Please do not share the code with renters, tenants or guests. Please follow all Clubhouse rules and guidelines which are posted in the Clubhouse. When each activity is finished, the responsible person should ensure cleanup, re-arrange the furniture as found, reset the air conditioners to the arrows on the controls, turn off the lights and fans, and remove all garbage and recyclables. Lock the doors.



Where do I put my garbage?

For Coach Home owners and guests: You have curbside pickup for trash. Please don't use the dumpsters in the two garbage compounds — those are only for Lakes (long buildings) Condo residents. Each Coach Home should have trash and recycling bins provided by Waste Management. If your green garbage or recycling bin needs to be repaired or replaced, call Waste Management at 239-252-2380.

For Lakes Condo residents:

- Bag your household trash and put it directly into one of the large dumpsters located in the two garbage compounds.
- Put recyclables in the yellow/green recycling bins — make sure everything goes in loose (not in plastic bags - Plastic bags are not recyclable)
- Break down all cardboard boxes before recycling.
- Don't leave anything — garbage, recycling, or large items — outside of the bins or dumpsters.

If the bins or dumpsters are full in one compound, feel free to use the other one.

For large item pickup, call Waste Management at 239-252-2380. Please don't put large items in or around the dumpsters or compounds.

Where do I find out about events happening in the community?

Do you have family or friends coming to use your unit at some point **when you will not be here**? If yes, you must fill out our Unaccompanied Guest Form. We love to have our family and friends enjoy our beautiful Wiggins community, but it is also important that we know who is here to ensure our safety and security.


As discussed in the last couple of Board meetings, we have had outsiders come in to try to use our pools and pickleball/tennis courts.

Our Guest Form will certainly not solve all of these issues, but it will help us know who is here. Here's how to use this:

- Go to the website and click on Documents/Forms
- Then click on Forms
- Then click on Unaccompanied Guest Form Online

That takes you to the form. You can complete it and submit it online. When you hit SUBMIT you are done and you will receive a response.

LANDSCAPE UPDATE FROM OUR LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE:

The New Year offers the opportunity to both reflect on the past and to look forward to the future. The landscaping committee formed following Hurricane Ian and, in the fall of 2023, identified 5 priorities:

1. Planting around mechanics
2. Replace privacy hedging along Gulf Harbor and Pan Am
3. Plant trees
4. Address fronts of buildings
5. Address sides and backs of buildings.

Along the way, water quality and quantity, irrigation system breaks and drainage problems were identified and addressed.

At the start of 2025 with a new landscaping company in place and increased funding due to the much needed and appreciated special assessment, we were ready to tackle priority 4. But the privacy hedging and some of the plantings around mechanics were not thriving and needed replacement. Additional irrigation systems and drainage problems kept popping up. It felt like two steps forward and one step backward as infrastructure items needed to be addressed prior to the completion of the visual design. But during the winter and spring of 2025 the fronts and sides of every building were attended to and thousands of plants placed. The look of community began to change! The privacy hedge along Pam Am was replaced and enhanced and over the summer it thrived. Most of the new plantings benefited from the summer and those who returned in the fall noticed considerable healthy growth.

Looking forward to 2026 we are in a good place. The ability to switch to municipal water if needed is established. Plantings that did not thrive are being replaced under warranty. Plantings around mechanics and bare sides of garages is proceeding. We have a good relationship with our landscapers which is beneficial as those unexpected, (yet expected) events such as irrigation system failures occur. We have a better handle on where drainage can be improved. Goals for this year include:

1. Continue to address “holes in design” regarding mechanicals, trees, fronts, and sides of buildings.
2. Continue to address drainage areas and areas of no vegetation (such as due to shading).

While concrete plans for addressing the backs of buildings are not in place at this time, it is not off the radar.

Moving forward, we propose the theme for this year to be: **Monitor, Maintain and Enhance.**

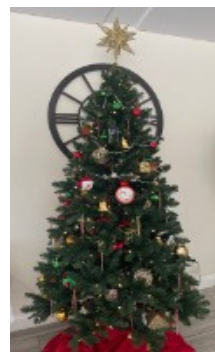


The holiday season at Wiggins kicks off with the UGLY SWEATER PARTY!
