So much has been accomplished: buildings have been painted, sheds have been


Vice President refurbished, and the landscaping throughout the community looks better than ever. These improvements have truly transformed our surroundings, and we hope you take joy in noticing them each day.

LANDSCAPE UPDATE FROM OUR LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE:

Thank you for all the wonderful feedback regarding the state of our landscaping. The summer season was a gift to our new plants. The overall impact of the differing textures and variegated greenery was impressive. Small plants filled in nicely. The structure of the design (finally) was evident!

Over the summer, our landscapers' focus was on replanting hedges as needed, filling in sod, and planting as needed for additional elements. The landscape committee (especially Don Rodner) and




board liaison members participated in many calls and contact with Leo Jr Landscaping while we were gone. Once the landscape committee was able to reconvene earlier this month, a detailed walk-through of the community was undertaken to look for "holes" in design (plants that did not thrive will be replaced under warranty as a separate issue). The following priorities were identified:

- 1. Planting around remaining general utility mechanics (piping).
- 2. Place small plantings along selected garage sides that are currently bare.
- 3. Place Mammay Crotons at one building and a tree at a building that have "holes" in design.
- 4. Address remaining identified drainage issues.
- 5. The remaining large project as identified under initial priorities is the backs of buildings. This initiative will not be able to be addressed at this time but is not off the radar.

The Secret Life of Bees

Advice for Wiggins residents: Don't poke the bears and don't poke the bees. Yes, we have both here. We have talked about the bears that have visited us from time to time in previous issues so let's talk about bees. Honey bees.

It seems that a certain bee colony likes to attach itself to a particular location in our complex. The new hive is the result of a "swarm" that occurs when a hive gets too big and the queen and some of the bees abandon the beehive and create a new one elsewhere. Hence, our new colony. A new queen will hatch in the old colony.

The "BUZZ" about bees - some fun facts:

- The average honey bee colony can make 60 pounds of honey per year.
- A single honey bee worker produces about 1½ of a teaspoon of honey in her lifetime.
- Queen bees are female.
- Worker bees are female.
- Drones are male.
- Bees fly about 55,000 miles about twice around the world - to make just one pound of honey.

A hive will typically make 2 ½ times more honey than it needs. A beekeeper only takes the excess honey, leaving the rest for the bees.

Our beekeeper will take the whole hive, thus, proving that a beekeeper keeps more than one bee.

Bees not only provide us with delicious and nutricious honey. But they are crucial to the existence of life on Earth.



Bees are needed to pollinate the flowers of many of the fruits, nuts, and vegetables humans rely on for food. Without bees, food would be in very short supply.

These Wiggins bees set up their hive in between the window and the storm shutter!

So the next time you hear a little extra buzzing around the community, remember that these tiny guests play an enormous role in keeping our world—and our community—thriving. Thanks to the care of our beekeeper and the cooperation of all our residents, we can safely admire these remarkable creatures while keeping Wiggins a welcoming place for everyone, bees included.

Let's Trash Talk...

With our busy season here, it's a good time for a quick reminder about trash and recycling! We've all seen what happens when garbage isn't handled the right way — messy dumpster areas and unwanted critters showing up. Let's all do our part to keep things clean and tidy.

For Coach Home owners and guests:

You have curbside pickup for trash. Please don't use the dumpsters in the two garbage compounds — those are only for Lakes Condo residents. Each Coach Home should have trash and recycling bins provided by Waste Management. If your green garbage or recycling bin needs to be repaired or replaced, call Waste Management at 239-252-2380.



For Lakes Condo owners and guests:

Bag your household trash and put it directly into one of the large dumpsters located in the two garbage compounds.

Put recyclables in the yellow/green recycling bins — make sure everything goes in loose (not in plastic bags). Plastic bags are not recyclable!

Break down all cardboard boxes before recycling.

Don't leave anything — garbage, recycling, or large items — outside of the bins or dumpsters. If the bins or dumpsters are full in one compound, feel free to use the other one.

For large item pickup, call Waste Management at 239-252-2380. Please don't put large items in or around the dumpsters or compounds.

Rental Information

As we head into the busy season here at Wiggins, we're excited to welcome back all our returning owners and guests! It's always great to see familiar faces and new ones, too. Just a reminder about a few important guidelines when it comes to renting or leasing your unit:

- Units can't be rented or leased for less than 30 consecutive days (or one calendar month, whichever is shorter).
- Each unit is allowed up to three (3) rental or lease periods per calendar year.
- The owner or leasing agent must give the Property Management Company at least 30 days' notice before the start of any new lease.
- All rental or lease agreements must be approved by the Board of Directors.
- The Property Management Company charges an application fee for each rental or lease.
- No pets or animals are allowed to be brought or kept by tenants or guests please remind your renters of this rule.

Please provide your renters with our Rules and Regulations - they are found on our website. If you have any questions about the rental process, reach out to Derek.

- A huge variety of pancake, waffle, crepe and omelet offerings. Their blueberry-stuffed French toast and waffle selections are fan favorites.

Tip: Go early (especially on weekends)





Let's Welcome Our Neighbors Back!

It's that time of year when we welcome back our 'snow birds' from all places north. A quick survey of our Owner's Directory reveals the geographic diversity of our seasonal travelers (and permanent residents, too!) As for the US, we come from every state east of the Mississippi and north of the Mason-Dixon Line, except for Delaware as well as Colorado, Kansas, New Mexico, Texas, Alabama, Tennessee and South Carolina. Of course, we know that Minnesota provides the headwaters and straddles the Mighty Mississippi!

This year we would especially like to welcome our friends, renters and co-owners from Canada. You primarily come from Ontario. From Sault St. Marie to Windsor - Ottawa to Waterloo - over a dozen cities plus Montreal. It has been a rough year for our Canadian neighbors between some economic hardships and the falling exchange rate.

With Ontario alone we both share over 1700 miles of border.



For those of us in Michigan, we are particularly affected as we share over 420 miles of border including through a small lake, three Great Lakes and three rivers. We have three bridges and a tunnel for crossing points. Economic travel and visitors make for a nearly constant flow of traffic. Western New York and Southeastern Ontario have been equally affected.

The first of next year we will have a new and magnificent bridge in Detroit – Windsor. The new Gordie Howe Bridge, entirely paid for by Canada, will span the half mile over the Detroit River making it the longest cable- stayed bridge span in North America. The towers on either side of the river are over 72 stories tall! Total cost is \$6.4 billion. Just another example of our ties to Canada.

Books for discussion are selected by the members of the Club; discussions are always engaging. (The October, December, and May meetings are held virtually; all other months meetings are in person.)



Mexican Train: Tuesdays, 7:00-9:00 PM. Wiggins Clubhouse. Mexican Train is a game played with dominoes; bring nickels and dimes to ante up and participate.



Sit and Sew: Thursdays from 10:00 AM-noon. Wiggins Clubhouse. Bring your own sewing, knitting, or other handiwork.



Rummikub: Fridays from 1:00 - 4:00 PM. Wiggins Clubhouse.



Euchre: Thursdays at 7:00 PM. (except for the third Thursday of the month when it shifts to Friday). Wiggins Clubhouse. Bring \$5.00 to play with a chance to win the pot at the end of the night.



Poker: Wednesdays at 7:00 PM. Wiggins Clubhouse.
