- **TEXTEDLY**: **ATTENTION OWNERS, ESPECIALLY OUR NEW OWNERS**! We have a texting program (Textedly) we use for sharing emergency and essential information. Now that hurricane season is upon us, we want to ensure that ALL our owners are on the Textedly list. If you have received our text messages in the past, you do not need to do anything you're all set. For our new owners, please provide Derek with your cell numbers. You may include as many cell numbers as you wish. For owners who already have your number registered, if you have an additional cell number you'd like to include, just let Derek know. Our goal has been to keep all our owners well informed, particularly during any storms. We will set up a Textedly text within the next couple of weeks. Reminder you can choose to opt out if you do not wish to receive the WLP texts by texting STOP to any text. If you do text STOP, you will be dropped from all future WLP texts.
